Town Board Meeting Highlights

January 28, 2023

This special Board meeting at Town Hall began at 11:00 AM and lasted 85 minutes. The meeting included an hour in executive session discussing legal matters.

Public discussion focused on the town-owned 15-foot-wide public recreational trail connecting Morey Road to adjacent state land. Supervisor Horton noted that the Town received a letter from the attorney representing Charles and Helen Johnson, who own property adjacent to the trail. The Board acknowledged the letter but denied any intentional blocking of access to private property. Based on a 2020 Order and Judgement from the New York State Supreme Court, the Board also described rights to groom and maintain the trail for snowmobile access, recreational use, and public safety.
