Town Board Meeting Highlights

September 24, 2025

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This work session at Town Hall began at 6:00 PM and lasted 90 minutes. Council Member DeLuca arrived at 6:15 PM. Discussion focused on the *Town of Caroga 2026 Tentative Budget* (see 2026 Tentative Budget: https://townofcaroga.com/finances/2025-10-07tentative.pdf).

Resolutions & Topics:

- 1. Call for Bids to Build Golf Storage and Maintenance Building at 1795 State Highway 10
 - The Board voted 4-0 to approve going out for bid to construct the Town of Caroga's Golf Storage and Maintenance Building at 1795 State Highway 10.
 - PE Darrin Romeyn DMR Engineering did 2025 engineering design specs for the concrete slab & enclosed pole barn (see https://townofcaroga.com/notes/2025 caroga pole barn.pdf).
 - From the date of bid award, a 90-day timeline is required for completion (i.e., 01/06/2026).
 - Construction bids will be accepted until Wednesday, October 8, 2025 at 3:00 PM.
 - A bid award will be selected at 7:15 PM at the monthly meeting on October 8, 2025.
- 2. Town of Caroga October 2025 Account Balances
 - Fund Balance: \$250,000 (To be used and depleted in 2026 with almost none for 2027)
 - <u>Unassigned General Account</u>: \$1,430,165.00
 - Reserve CD Savings Account: \$2,075,983.00 (Includes Clubhouse Insurance Revenue)

New York State's property tax cap limits levy growth at either **2%** or the rate of inflation, whichever is less. An exception allows a tax cap override by Town Board majority vote.

Several specific items are notable in the 2026 Tentative Budget, as initially proposed.

- The Board proposes raising the Highway Superintendent salary to \$70,200 in 2026. This \$70,200 Highway Superintendent Salary would be the highest in Fulton County. The County median is \$54,000 and range is \$41,500 (Stratford) to \$70,000 (Johnstown). Historically, Caroga's Highway Superintendent budgeted salary was \$51,500 in 2023, \$60,000 in 2024, and then dropped back to \$51,500 for 2025 after Mr. Voght resigned. The 01/08/2025 Caroga News Flash reported the Board set Mr. Stock's 2025 salary at \$57,500, but 01/08/2025 official Town Minutes reported a \$67,500 salary (not \$51,500).
- Per Teamsters Union contract, Highway employees will receive a 4% annual raise.

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- Per Town Board proposal, some other employees have a tentative 4% annual raise.
- Those with a <u>4% annual raise</u> include: Golf Superintendent (\$72,420), Code Officer (\$61,787), Town Clerk (\$51,417), Golf Cart Storage Contractor (\$42,000), Assessor (\$31,200), Bookkeeper (\$29,855), Youth Director (\$25,000), Town Justice (\$22,880), Deputy Town Clerk (\$10,000), Court Clerk (\$9,360), Budget Director (\$3,422), Highway Secretary (\$2,510), Supervisor Secretary (\$1,500), Webmaster (\$750)
- Those with NO annual raise include: Golf Club Manager (\$26,000), Trail Manager (\$24,000), Town Hall Maintenance (\$19,000), Supervisor (\$18,000), BTI Supervisor (\$17,480), Invasive Species Director (\$16,000), Dog Control Officer (\$5,869), Town Board Member (\$3,600), Youth Recreation Staff (\$3,600 Total for all Youth Staff), Boat Wash & Stewards Coordinator (\$2,370), Planning Clerk (\$2,000), Zoning Clerk (\$1,400), Substance Compliance Officer (\$1,000), Assessment Review Board Members (\$1,000 Total for all BAR Members), Registrar (\$885), Historian (\$800)
- o Many of Caroga's Programs are run by local volunteers who donate time and resources.
- Tentative changes are made to specific General Townwide budget items.
- Proposed Comprehensive Planning Grant balances \$130,500 in Expenses & Revenues.
- Contractual Engineering Planning for Town Buildings is maintained at \$100,000.
- Nick Stoner Golf Course Expenses and Revenues increase across budget lines.
- Recreation Project Budget for trails decreases to \$109,000 with less grant revenues.
- o Lake Management Environmental Control decreases to \$137,970 with fewer divers.
- o Lake Management C/E line increases from \$36,000 to \$66,400 for lake mapping.
- Basic Highway Department budget increases include multiple areas.
- Additions include the Capehorn Bridge Replacement Contractual Expense of \$87,500.
- The new highway truck adds annual bond principal and interest expenses of \$50,000.
- Traffic control sign funds increase from \$2,500 to \$10,000.
- Road Repair Personal Services increase from \$172,000 to \$200,000.
- Snow removal Personal Services increase from \$185,000 to \$205,000.

4. 2026 Fire Contract

- With the Town Board not approving a 2026 Fire District, the Board maintains jurisdiction.
- Brian McIntosh of the Caroga Lake Volunteer Fire Company presented to the Board and answered questions about the proposed budget, expenses, equipment, and vehicles.
- The proposed 2026 contract goes to \$256,017, with a one-time \$58,907 revenue offset.
- The proposed 2026 Fire Contract Tax Levy is \$1.18 per thousand assessed value. This remains below that of other nearby volunteer fire companies (e.g., Ephratah \$1.93, Pleasant Square \$2.26, Meco & Town of Johnstown \$3.33), and Mr. McIntosh noted that Caroga Lake Volunteer Fire Company has maintained lean budgets that are well below other companies largely because volunteers donate time and offset costs.
- Town Board members asked the Volunteer Fire Company to tighten the proposed budget.

5. Next Budget Meeting

- The next budget work session will be Tuesday October 7 starting at noon.
- The next step will be to move from the 2026 Tentative Budget to the Preliminary Budget.
